Work through the following questions on your own, and get together with your running partner, life group, or family around the dinner table and talk through your answers.

Discussion Questions

1. Using both Scripture and the NDE accounts, John painted a picture of the sheer awesomeness of Heaven, one that’s very different from the common picture of angels sitting on clouds playing harps. If Heaven is really that great, why don’t we talk more about it as a church?
2. Scripture and NDEs both describe a book containing our life’s events, how confident or concerned are you about the details being written about you?
3. Do you anticipate receiving any rewards in heaven for what you have done with your life? Why?
4. Read Matthew 25:14-30. The Bible says that our deeds don’t save us, but they determine the extent of God’s rewards for us in heaven. Why do you think our deeds should matter? Should it be enough for us to just get into Heaven, or are we expected to do more?
5. What has been the easiest way for you to serve God by serving others? What has been the hardest?
6. If our life on Earth is truly about preparing us for eternal life, what do you think you’ll be doing to serve God in heaven?

7. How has your imagination of heaven changed as a result of reading the book and having these discussions?

8. Read Colossians 3:23-24. How can you approach your work in the days ahead – whether on the job or at home or elsewhere – with a fresh attitude of doing that work for God Himself, rather than for a boss, a family member or even yourself?
